The valid contacts will be those made in any mode or band from 160 meters to 6 meters with the 10 special AOxIARU stations. The special stations will be:

AO100IARU – AO1IARU – AO2IARU – AO3IARU – AO4IARU AO5IARU – AO6IARU – AO7IARU – AO8IARU – AO9IARU

DATES: From April 15 to April 30, 2025.

DIPLOMAS

Diplomas are awarded in three different categories depending on the number of special AOxIARU stations contacted by the applicant (or reports in the case of SWLs).

BRONZE DIPLOMA

Stations in Europe: Awarded to stations with at least 5 contacts with different AOxIARU special stations, regardless of mode and band. Stations outside Europe: Granted to stations with at least 4 contacts with different AOxIARU special stations, regardless of mode and band.

SILVER DIPLOMA

Stations in Europe: Awarded to stations that, on at least 3 different bands, have managed to contact a minimum of 7 AOxIARU stations on each of those bands (e.g., 3 bands between 160m and 6m, with 7 contacts per band and a minimum of 7 special callsigns per band), regardless of mode (total of 21 contacts, 7 stations per band). Stations outside Europe: Awarded to stations that, on at least 3 different bands, have managed to contact a minimum of 6 AOxIARU stations on each of those bands (e.g., 3 bands between 160m and 6m, with 6 contacts per band and a minimum of 6 special callsigns per band), regardless of mode (total of 18 contacts, 6 stations per band).

GOLD DIPLOMA

Stations in Europe: Awarded to stations that, on at least 3 different bands, have managed to contact all 10 AOxIARU stations on each of those bands (e.g., 3 bands between 160m and 6m, with 10 contacts per band, each with one of the 10 special callsigns per band), regardless of mode (total of 30 contacts).

Stations outside Europe: Awarded to stations that, on at least 3 different bands, have managed to contact 7 AOxIARU stations on each of those bands

(e.g., 3 bands between 160m and 6m, with 7 contacts per band, each with one of the 7 special callsigns per band), regardless of mode (total of 21 contacts).

All Diplomas will indicate the name and callsign of the applicant and their ranking position within their DXCC based on the total number of valid QSOs.

TROPHIES

ANNIVERSARY MEDAL:

A special medal will be awarded to each of the licensed participants with the highest number of different contacts with AOxIARU special stations in different modes and bands according to the following rankings:

Top 15 Spain: To the 15 highest-ranked operators from Spain (EA, EA6, EA8, EA9)

Top 5 Europe: To the 5 highest-ranked operators from Europe

Top 5 North America: To the 5 highest-ranked operators from North America

Top 5 South America: To the 5 highest-ranked operators from South America

Top 5 Asia: To the 5 highest-ranked operators from Asia Top 5 Africa: To the 5 highest-ranked operators from Africa

Top 5 Oceania: To the 5 highest-ranked operators from Oceania

Trophies are not cumulative, meaning that Spanish operators (EA, EA6, EA8, and EA9) who have received the medal cannot qualify for the general continental classification medal.

Any other participant may request a medal from the online store after the event concludes.

For ranking purposes, the valid contacts will be those made in each one of the three modes: 1.- SSB, 2.- CW, and 3.- Digital modes, as well as in each of the following bands: 160m, 80m, 60m, 40m, 30m, 20m, 17m, 15m, 12m, 10m, and 6m. Each combination of mode and band counts only the first time it is made. Duplicate contacts do not count for the ranking.

In the event of a tie in the ranking by number of QSOs, the station that made the last contact first will prevail.

The log can be consulted online in real-time, and participants' ranking positions can be followed daily on the website https://iaru100.ure.es.

It is recommended to attempt to repeat the contact if a station is not found in the online log. An effort will be made to review claims during the diploma event.

However, within 10 days after its conclusion, any participant may submit a justified claim if they believe a QSO is not properly reflected in the online log

APPLICATIONS:

Participants can download their personalized diploma in PDF format from the official website for free. There is no need to send QSO logs as the log will be available on the website.

SWLs must send their list of received stations to iaru100@ure.es by May 31, 2025, and the Diploma will be sent via email.

The top-ranked participants in each ranking by QSO number will receive the special medal free of charge at their postal address. The list of medal candidates by category will be available online daily. After the event concludes, winners must provide their postal address by sending an email to iaru100@ure.es.

Participants wishing to receive a commemorative special medal may request one at a cost of €25 (twenty-five euros), including shipping costs.

If a participant wishes to receive their diploma printed on high-quality paper, they can request it at a cost of €8 (eight euros) for a single copy, €10 (ten euros) for two copies, and €13 (thirteen euros) for three copies. These costs include shipping expenses.
